Dear Amon:

Thanks a lot for sending me the tear sheets from the Fort Worth Star Telegram of April 14th and 15th having reference to your boy and his associate Lt. Jones, having been taken prisoners in central Tunisia by the Germans and removed to Germany. I join with you in rejoicing that he is a prisoner of war instead of being lost. You can at least look forward to meeting him in the flesh again.

My only remaining son, Francis D. (Bud) Mitchell is a first lieutenant in the 302nd Ordnance Regiment now stationed in North Africa and I believe in Morocco. He came very near not getting there because his transport was sunk east of Bermuda but fortunately the personnel of his organization were rescued and returned to Bermuda and reoutfitted. In a letter received from him yesterday he stated, "I know exactly where all my things are, but I'll tell the cockeyed world I'm not going after them. Ole David Jones can keep them -- and now I can say we are most happy to have arrived well and sound."

With renewed assurance of my high regard, I am with all good wishes.
