

~~Today~~, April 29, 1943 received first direct word from Amon, Jr., ~~consisting~~

~~of~~ a letter dated March 20, 1943, also a post card dated March 25th, 1943, stating

that he was in fine health and receiving good treatment. He also advised that ~~he~~ *after*

*hiding* ~~was hidden~~ behind the German lines for nine days - February 14th to 23rd - ~~that~~ he

was taken prisoner by the Germans and flown from Africa to Italy by plane and from

Italy to Germany he ~~went~~ *traveled* by train to his present location -- *an office* ~~is~~ *British & American* camp for prisoners of

war located at Rotenberg, Germany, 24 miles ~~East~~ East of Kassel.

~~This day~~, March 11, 1943, at 9:30 A.M. a telegram was received from the War Department advising that Lt. Amon G. Carter, Jr., had been "missing in action" in North Africa since February 14, 1943.

~~Today~~, April 14, 1943, a long distance telephone call was received from Colonel Chas. A. Easterbrook of the War Department at 1:20 P.M. advising that Amon Junior was a prisoner of war in Germany. And, at 6:50 P.M. the following telegram signed by the Adjutant General Ulio was received:

"Lt. Amon G. Carter, Junior, reported prisoner of war of the German Government. Letter follows. "
