This day, March 11, 1943, at 9:30 A.M. a telegram was received from the War Department advising that t. Amon G. Carter, Jr., had been "missing in action" in North Africa since February 14, 1943.

Today, April 14, 1943, a long distance telephone call was received from Colonel Chas. A. Easterbrook of the War Department at 1:20 P.M. advising that Amon Junior was a prisoner of war in Germany. And, at 6:50 P.M. the following telegram signed by the Adjutant General Ulio was received:

"Lt. Amon G. Carter, Junior, reported prisoner of war of the German Government. Letter follows."
