Now school is out and I will have more time to write to you. I said for it is easier for a camel to go through a needles eye than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of ~~God~~ God. for my verse Charlie said if ye love me keep my commandments. me and brother washed up the dishes then went to town after some Pot ash for little sister and Charlie we got <sup>a</sup> stick of wax too and Dr. Mcgaughey gave Charlie a half a stick. we stoped at aunt Allies to take her some eggs. Brother sells 25 ct worth of eggs every week. I am going directly to fix our dinner, mamma was cross enough of <sup>a</sup> morning to eat
