My brother wrote headquarters of the
91st F.A., and received a reply some time
ago. It occurred to me that Mr. Carter
might do as we do when we see word
about Anson Jr. - that is to think the boys
probably were together - at least part of the time.
This Y letter I shall quote in the part that
may interest you - of Anson's friends -

"Bruce was surrounded at his
location, by the enemy and was unable
to withdraw with our unit. We later
learned from a sergeant of another

"He can give you the information since Mrs. Lee has already received notification."

My brother Mr. Wm. B. Lee, Capt. in last war, acknowledged, and informed the Captain that Bruce lived.

I do not like to trust the letter to Lloyd. I may value it too highly. To me, it is a Citation of bravery. Strongly I dare say it'll state no ribbons. I think Amos J. was right there.

I have as yet no direct news of Bruce. I hope he is sound - and both of the boys will be discreet (!) and LUCKY.
