It was indeed thoughtful of you to send me the card you received from my son, Amon Junior, dated June 22, 1944 as it is the only communication we have had from him during the month of June. I received several cards and a couple of letters written in May and cards have been received dated in July but something must have happened to his June letters.

Doubtless, you realize that mail is the most important morale builder and all they have to look forward to, so I hope you will write Amon Junior when you have the time. All of his family and friends here write him quite frequently and he seems to appreciate it tremendously. From all indications his spirits are very good and in his July mail he said they hoped to be seeing Texas soon. As the new prisoners are taken into the camp they inform the boys already there of the situation and doubtless they are pretty well informed on the progress of the war - probably both sides.

Your card is being returned, herewith, and again I appreciate your giving me the privilege of seeing it.
