Since I heard that some of the officers from Oflag 64 got away when the Germans tried to move, I have been looking and listening for something, but I haven't heard it. I would like to know what you have heard.

I haven't been able to keep up with the news so well since I got up here since I have been out in the field most of the time. We got back on the post yesterday.

We wish to thank you for being so nice to us when we were through. We enjoyed it so very much. I had to drink some of that good whiskey while I was in the field to warm ~~the~~ me and my sleeping bag up. But I still have two

bottle to keep for a special occasion. And I am so proud of my hat. I thought you were kidding me at first about giving me a hat after seeing all the important people you had given those hats to.

I hope, Sir, that you are hearing from Simon Jr. regularly and that he is getting along as well as he can when I was with him. If you have time, I would appreciate hearing what you know of the boys.
