Dear Lt. Meadows:

I have delayed acknowledging your letter of March 11 with the hope that I would be able to give you some news about Amon. However, nothing has been received from or about him although each day information comes in concerning others who have been liberated from Oflag 64. I am sure you would like to know that Ernest Ranok of Austin, Colonel Yardley of Dublin, Philip Poteet of Fort Worth, Walter Parks of Breckenridge, and Fred Ostrander and many others from Texas have been liberated.

Lt. Bill Everett of Sweetwater, Texas, who was one of the eight to be flown back from Moscow, and his wife, spent the night here last night, but he could give me no information beyond their first night out. However, he is of the opinion that the main body was placed on a train the following day, the direction of which is unknown.

It was nice to have you and your wife for a little visit and if you have an opportunity to be in this vicinity again, we shall be happy to see you, and I shall be glad to pass along any news I may receive about the boys in Oflag 64.
