Amon Junior has been a prisoner of war in Germany for eighteen months and until of late we have heard from him rather consistently every four or five weeks. However, the last mail from him or anyone we know of from his particular camp has been dated in May, so naturally I am quite concerned and anxious to hear again.

Since you request a picture of Amon Junior for your son's scrapbook, I am sending a couple of clippings concerning his activities, which I feel would be more appropriate for the purpose you intend you make use of it.

I enjoyed looking over the "Guinea Gold" published for the boys in the service in that theater of war.

I shall be glad to pass your message along to Dr. Walker when I see him.
