Dear Mr. Carter:

It was especially thrilling to see the article in the paper about your son being liberated from a Luckenwalde prison camp in the recent Allied drives in Germany.

My nephew, Pfc. Charles J. Holland, Jr., was a prisoner in a Luckenwalde camp, and he was last heard from in a letter written on January 12, 1945, in which he mentioned being in charge of 200 other soldiers. This was probably due to his knowledge of the German language. At the time he entered the Army he was a senior in Rice Institute and languages comprised a large part of his course of study.

We have heard nothing from him since the liberation of the camps in Luckenwalde; in the event you should receive a list of Texas boys who have been liberated from Nazi prison camps in which Charles Holland's name appears, it would be greatly appreciated if you would wire his father, Charles J. Holland, Sr., Rado Refining Company, McAllen, Texas, collect.
