## Amon Carters Meet After Liberation

WITH THE U. S. 9th ARMY, May 5— (UP) —An American task force of one armored car and four jeeps went to Luckenwalde prison camp to liberate Lt. Amon Carter Jr., son of the prominent Texas publisher, and four other Texas lieutenants, two of them cousins of Jesse Jones, former secretary of commerce.

Carter's liberation coincided with a visit to the 9th Army front by his father, one of the group of editors who visited German death camps on the western front.

Young Carter refused to leave the camp until he was assured trucks were coming to rescue nearly 5,000

men still there.

The first thing he said when he met his father was:

"Dad, we have got to get the rest

of those guys right away."

"The General will take care of that," Amon Carter Sr., replied.
