
Dear Amon:

Today we are all sharing in the thankfulness that the war in Europe has come to a victorious end. To you I know it brings a special kind of joy as I recently read that your son, Lieutenant Amon Carter, Jr., had been liberated from the German prison camp at Luckenwald.
