I was quite pleased to read in the New York Sun of May 7 that you had located your son and that he apparently is in good shape physically. I am also pleased that you were one of the prominent Americans who had opportunity to view at first hand the atrocities which have been committed in the various German prison camps.

I hope that we will soon be able to finish the Japanese end of the war so that we can have all of our boys back. My son-in-law, Lieutenant Colonel Girard of the Ninth Air Force, who, by the way, is an alumnus of Culver, has been in Europe now since September, 1942.
