Dear Amon:

You don't know how glad I was to read in last Sundays Telegram that you had found your boy and that he is now with you and I hope that his stay in the German Prison camp has not incapacitated him from being strong and well again.

We civilians who have not seen the horrible tortures our boys have gone through at the hands of the Germans cannot concieve of how terrible it has been and in my opinion we are being entirely too lenient with the German POW's we have over here.

Ray is now in South America with the Rubber Development Corporation. She waited about 8 months for something in the Library field to turn up and as nothing worthwhile did, she accepted this position.

Since going to South America, she has received an inquery from OWI as to her availability for service in Germany in the Library service and I have forwarded the inquery to her, but I do not know if RDC will release her in case she would want to accept the O.W.I.offer.

I just wanted you to know that I am happy that your boy is alive and I sincerely hope that he is strong and well.
