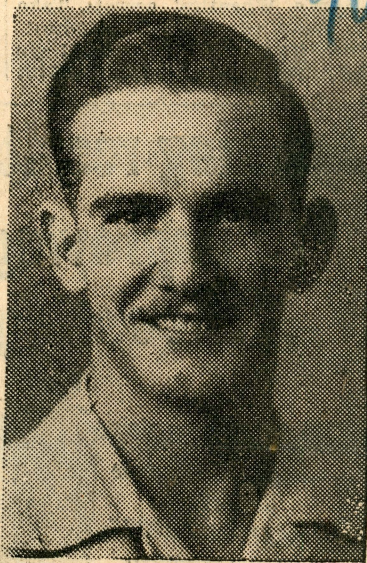

Sgt. Billy Wallace
Freed From Prison

A story relating to the liberation of a Terrell boy, Sgt. Billy J. Wallace, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. P. Wallace of Terrell, was told by Robert Wear, Fort Worth Star-Telegram correspondent in Europe, recently in that paper. The dispatch was dated May 1, and was written from Paris, France. Liberated along with Wallace were a number of other Texas boys, including the son of Amon Carter, publisher of the Star-Telegram. The boys, as may be imagined, were supremely happy over their liberation and, as a matter of course, their first thought is to get home to see loved ones. And the government is doing all in its power to see that this is done. They will be sent home as soon as ships can be provided for their passage.

Mrs. Louis Wallace, wife of Sgt. Wallace, is making her home in Corsicana. Her husband had been a prisoner of the Germans for four months. He was first reported missing in action, but later located in a Nazi prison.
