Lt. Amon Carter Liberated, Joins Dad In Germany

AT THE 83RD DIVISION COMMAND POST, Germany, May 5 (AP). —A Texas newspaper publisher and his son, a prisoner of the Germans since Faid Pass, Tunisia, over two years ago, embraced wordlessly here today and then the young soldier announced:

"We've got to go back and get those other fellows."

The reunion took place between Amon Carter, Sr., publisher of the Fort Worth Star Telegram, and his son, Amon Jr., who was liberated by a special patrol sent to get him from the Luckenwalde prison in time for the event.

The young infantry officer walked up behind his father and said quietly, "Here I am Dad." His father turned around obviously overcome with emotion, embraced him and patted him on the back wordlessly.

The lieutenant, overcoming visible embarrassment before the party of Army personnel and press representatives, kept saying:

"We've got to go back and get those other fellows. They're worried about the Russian-German fights going on all around them and we've got to get them."

An American Army Corps commander assured him arrangements were being made to evacuate all the prisoners at Luckenwalde.
