Dear Sir:

I am again taking the liberty of writing you in regard to our boys at Oflag 64. Knowing that you have many ways of getting news that most people do not have, I feel that you may be able to pass on some information to me.

The last word I had from my son, Lt. John R. Rodgers, was dated December 10th., and as you know, many things and many changes have taken place since then. In yesterday's Dallas News, I noticed an article stating that you had received word through the State Department concerning the camp; that it had been moved further inside Germany. According to radio reports, I was under the impression that they were located somewhere near Sagan, south of Berlin, but the article stated that the camp had been moved from Stettin.

I know just how anxious you are concerning the welfare of your son; just that anxious and uneasy is also my state. So any word or bit of information will be greatly appreciated. Would especially like to know if you think they may be getting their food packages, whether the Germans may harm them physically; if the Red Cross will be able to function with them moving so often. The last letter from my son indicated that the food situation might be acute.

If you know of any means I might employ to aid the situation of my son, such information will be more than appreciated.

Hoping that you have had recent word from your own son, and that all of our boys will soon be liberated, I am
