Dear Miss Roggen:

Your letter of March 23 received advising that your brother, Lt. Teddy Roggen, is interned in Oflag 64, Germany and that he has written you to contact me for information in speeding mail to him.

We send the mail as you are doing- airmail, and have no other means than the regular channels of getting mail to Amon Junior. If he receives his mail sooner, it is merely a coincidence as some of his letters are months reaching him. Thirty days has been the quickest that mail has come from him and some of it has taken seven weeks. His last letter was dated February 18 and was received March 20 and from all indications they are getting along as well as possible.

Any time you have any information from your brother we should be glad to have it and will in turn send you any we have from Amon Junior.
