Will Rogers was in Fort Worth week before last and we gave him a special party, similar to the party you attended during the oil convention, other than there were about fifty people present.

We hooked up Frank Clarity's private car and carried him up to Amarillo where he showed last Monday night. Incidentally a friend of mine on the Bartlett Ranch had sent me a nice wild turkey and a choice cut of Elk's meat and Mr. Clarity's cook prepared the wild turkey that night on the car and it was the most delicious I have ever experienced and I wish you could have been with us. We had a real enjoyable trip and Will autographed a few books for me, one of which was for you. I am sending it, together with this letter, by airmail and am sure that both you and Mrs. Teagle will enjoy the book.

Will had an audience in Amarillo of about 5,000. By the way, while I am discussing Amarillo, I would like to know if my friend Colonel Thompson ever made good delivering six prairie chickens to your car. He promptly wired me that the matter would be attended to, meanwhile he left to attend the American Legion Convention in Philadelphia and I have never been able to find out whether you received the chickens or not.

I was sorry not to have been able to make the trip with you and while your crowd could only see one ball game from the looks of the score, they must have had as much baseball in one day as you ordinarily would have had in three games in St. Louis. I received your wire from Poplar Bluff and hope that you had a fine trip.

Incidentally, I had the pleasure of taking Dr. Schmidts to the ball game, together with Mr. Olwell. Dr. Schmidts was an associate of the honor guest of your trip.

Tell Mrs. Teagle that Mrs. Phil E. Laughlin, Mrs. Carter's sister, is in the plaza at this time and if she has an opportunity I hope she will call her up.
