WILL ROGERS "KIDNAPED" IN AIR!

And Fort Worth, Tex., Editor Scores Coup on Dallas

Will Rogers finished up with "The Connecticut Yankee" at the Fox studios Sunday night and Monday morning early was being whisked across the landscape in an airplane. Monday evening he arrived in Fort Worth, Texas, or rather 200 miles or so this side of there, for Amon G. Carter, the editor of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram, came out to meet him in an airplane to escort him to Fort Worth before Dallas, on the regular airway, could see him first, Mr. Carter feeling that way and worse about Dallas.

Will had been receiving letters and messages from Texas suggest-

ing that he come over that way and talk to the poor folks who are out of grub in Texas, Arkansas and Oklahoma. He is going on to New York first and then come back down that way and give lectures in the large towns for the benefit of the fund for the jobless. Carter and Jesse Jones, the oil magnate of Texas, who lives at Fort Worth, were to meet Rogers at Fort Worth to make arrangements for his speaking tour. Frank Hawks, holder of the transcontinental flight record, will do the piloting when Rogers gets back there in his old stamping ground to make folks laugh for the benefit of the poor.

He will be gone about six weeks.
