**One of Will's Cracks  
Calls for Comment.**

**W**ILL ROGERS told Governor Sterling during a popcall at Austin that every baby in Fort Worth is taught to love God and hate Dallas. Will has attained to that enviable state among his less-favored fellow-Americans where he can say anything that spontaneous combustion may prompt and get by with it.

What he said of the Fort Worth attitude toward Dallas was just some more funny stuff. Nobody was expected to believe it, hence it isn't offensive. But it is somewhat provocative.

There was a time, when Will was a yearling on the range around Claremore, when a spirit of rivalry existed between Fort Worth and Dallas that was not always neighborly. But most of that spirit had passed by the time Will had succeeded in breaking into big-time stuff. There isn't much of it now, if any. The active alignment of the builders of the two cities in furthering projects of great and mutual importance is certain to wipe out every vestige of a senseless prejudice.

In a thousand ways the interests of the cities are vitally joined. Their citizens see that. And the babies of today, whatever they may be taught to love or to hate, will be seeing it more clearly even before they are old enough to leave high school.
