Dear Amon:

I had a conference today with some Texas people, and agreed to go along with them on the Convention for Dallas in 1936. I am writing you at this time so that you may save any effort you may be putting forth in behalf of Fort Worth.

It was felt among the Administration leaders here in Washington that Dallas has been seriously overlooked by this Administration, and this would be a very nice gesture. They have a fine city there, as I observed during my brief stay last fall. They have the necessary hotels and buildings that could be utilized for convention purposes. I think it would be a fine gesture for us to do it, and I know that in your usual "Christian" spirit you would be very happy to go along on this decision, inasmuch as "recognition is being given to West Texas."

Before any definite statement is given to the press as to the Administration's attitude, I thought it might be well to have your approval. Will you please write or wire immediately upon receipt of this letter.
