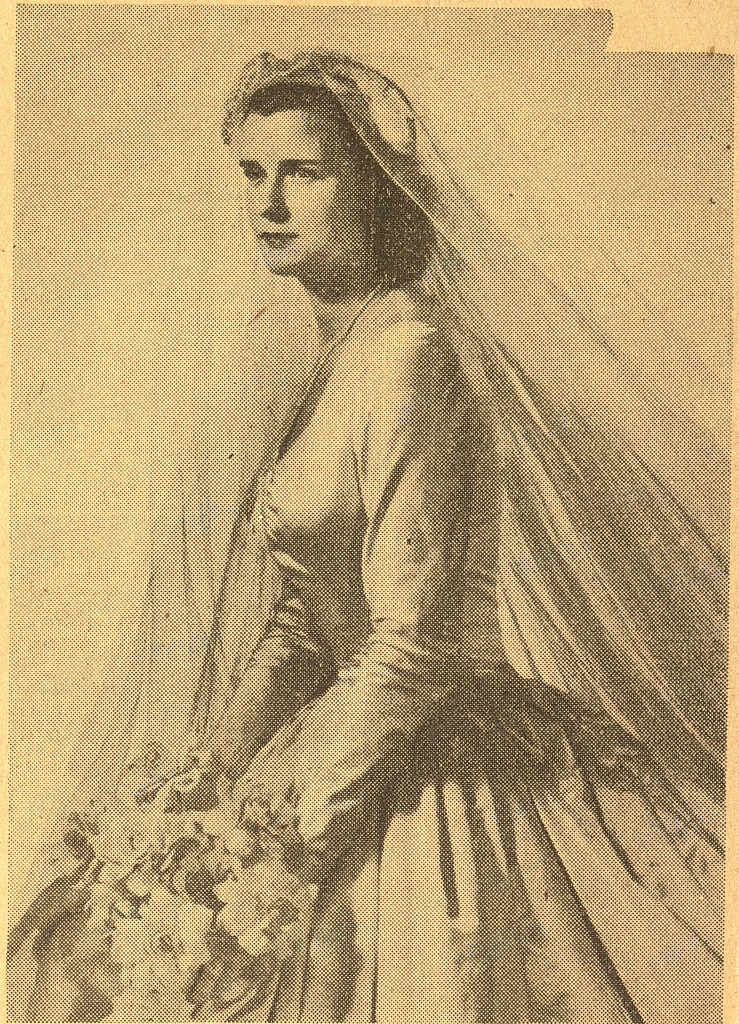

Hickey. Both clergymen are uncles of the bridegroom.

Given in marriage by her father, Miss Farley wore classically fashioned ivory satin and full length veil of ivory illusion cascading from a cap of heirloom rosepoint lace. She carried an old fashioned bouquet of white camellias.

The bride was attended by her sister, Betty, as honor maid and the bridegroom's sister, Eileen, Betty Ann Lasette, Glenn Crawley, and Barbara and Phyllis Feldman of New York.
