I want to apologize for being so slow to acknowledge the arrival of your letter and the enclosed pictures of Amos Jr and the others in GERMANY. It was nice of you to send them so promptly and I want you to know how much I appreciate your answering my request for the pictures.

My change from Army life to civilian life has taken place and I'm now back in civies again and feeling just a little strange after over four years service.

I am quite anxious to know if you have any other news concerning Amos

Jr. Now that so many prison camps in  
Germany have been taken by the Americans,  
I am hoping that Amos is safe again.

I'm so anxious to see some of the old 91<sup>st</sup>  
gang again that I hope they all have  
survived their long imprisonment.

You can be sure any news of Amos Jr.  
or the fellows of the 91<sup>st</sup> will be appreciated.

Thank again for your kindness in sending  
me the nice letter and the pictures.
