Dear Mrs. Spence:

Your card of March 28th received advising that you had been notified that your husband, has been liberated and I want you to know that I share your happiness with you and am delighted that you have had such good news.

This morning, I received a card from Amos Jr, dated February 7th, and written from Stalag III A, in Luckenwalde which is about thirty miles south of Berlin. From the various cards received by next-of-kin of those who were not liberated they must be split up into three groups: part of them are at Luckenwalde, part of them at Parchim which is about 75 miles East of Hamburg and South of Rostock and the others at Hammelburg which is near Frankfurt and have probably been released by Patton's army.

I hope Lt. Spence will soon be home and would like to talk to him if he is in this vicinity any time.
