
Dear Folks:

This morning I have received a card dated January 4 from my son who is a prisoner of war in Germany and interned in Oflag 64, which was located at Schubin in the Polish Corridor. He advised that Lt. Sutton had reached that camp. I am sure you have been advised of the location of Lt. Sutton, however I felt that you would like to have this bit of information for whatever it may be worth.

I am sure you have seen by the press reports that the members of this particular camp have been reported to have been evacuated, the whereabouts of which we have been unable to ascertain. If you should have any information at any time, I would be glad to hear from you and will likewise pass any along that I may receive.

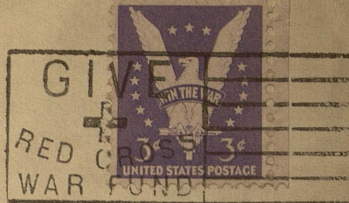
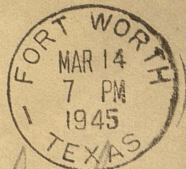
