Dear Folks:

In Mr. Carter's absence from the city a letter has arrived from his son, Lt. Amon G. Carter, Jr., who is a prisoner of war interned at Oflag 64, Germany, dated October 10, in which he asks his father to communicate with you and advise that Lt. A. L. Vetrano Jr. has arrived at that prisoner of war camp from France.

In the event you have not already received the information from the War Department, this camp is for officers only and is located about 100 miles south of Danzig near the Vistula River at a little town called Schubin in the Polish Corridor. If you have not been advised by the War Department, please let us know and information will be given you as to how to write and send packages.

The wife of another prisoner received a letter today dated December 10 and from that letter they were apparently getting along all right, however, October 10 is the latest letter Mr. Carter has received.

Any time you have any information of interest from Lt. Vetrano, Mr. Carter would be glad to have you let him know, and we, in turn, will pass on any information received at this office.
