My husband, Frank Vinson, who is a prisoner of war in Germany wrote me recently that your son was a member of the same prison camp as he; namely, Oflag 64.

The last letter I received from him was dated January 8th, which was before the camp was moved. It is my understanding these men were moved on foot in sub-zero weather and since their physical condition could not have been any too good because of lack of sufficient food, am quite concerned over my husband, and the others.

I was wondering if you have had any communication from or of your son since their removal. If so, I shall appreciate it very much if you can find it convenient to let me know.

My father-in-law, F. M. Vinson, of Texarkana, Ark., wrote me that he had received a very nice letter from you.
