

Send the following telegram, subject to the terms on back hereof, which are hereby agreed to

Fort Worth, Texas, October 6, 1943.

Colonel Howard F. Bresse, C. M. P., Chief, Information Bureau, Office of The Provost Marshal General Was Department, Washington, D.C.

The overseas soldiers in actual service are permitted to receive Christmas packages from not only their first-of-kin but friends as well, while prisoners-of-war are permitted only one eleven pound package every sixty days. Why not accord them the same privilege as our soldiers? There are no restrictions from the German end of the line and these boys, among which is my son, Amon Junior, should be permitted to the same liberal treatment PERIOD Please advise who makes this arbitrary rule concerning the prisoners of war and why?
