Your letter mailed just a month ago reached me only today. I am somewhat isolated at present, having been assigned as U. S. Navy War Correspondent to the Home Fleet for a four months period which will be completed June 20. Then I shall be back in London. I am forwarding your clipping to the London bureau for all the staff to see.
