Dear Amon,

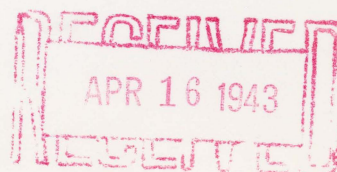
