My dear Mr. Carter:

It was kind and thoughtful of you to send me your telegram of this morning. I was planning to send you a telegram when I received this. I received a message from the War Department two days ago that Keith is a prisoner of war in Germany, and we are now waiting for a letter from Adjutant General Ulio, advising us of his location so that we may write to him through the Red Cross.

The fact that we appear to have received this notice simultaneously and that these boys are both in Germany, and the facts of their capture being so similar, leads me to hope that they may be together. From what I hear of your boy, I trust that this is true. I reckon it gets pretty lonesome for an American boy in a German camp.

I thank you again for your telegram and rejoice with you in the relief that it has brought you. I hope that it will happen that we may meet in future. I also hope that if these boys are exchanged and come home together that Amon Junior will break his trip by stopping at our home with Keith.
