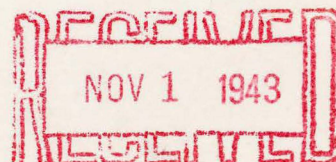
I am in receipt of a letter from Mr. Byron Price, Director of Censorship, copy of which I am enclosing herewith.

My dear Mr. Speaker:

In response to your letter of October 18, I am glad to enclose a copy of a letter written Mr. Amon Carter on October 15 by Colonel Carlson, the Chief Postal Censor.

The difficulty was, apparently, that Mr. Carter was including tobacco in packages without proper tobacco labels as stipulated by the Provost Marshal General. You will note also that Colonel Carlson is urging the modification of some of these regulations to enlarge the allowance.

Naturally I want to be of help in every way possible. If you have any further suggestion to make, I know you will tell me.
