Your letter of October 11 has been received during Mr. Carter's absence from the State and shall be brought to his attention as soon as he returns.

Meanwhile, any bit of information, no matter how trivial it seems to you that you could pass along concerning the camp life, Amon Junior and the boys you left in Oflag 64, will be very much appreciated.

Lt. Meadow of Opp, Alabama sent Mr. Carter some kodak pictures which he brought out of the camp and were sent at the request of Amon Junior. Naturally, these made all of us very happy as he appeared to be in better health and spirits than the first picture we had of him taken upon his arrival at the camp. Also, Colonel Drake who has just returned from Oflag 64, spent this past weekend with Mr. Carter in New York and we are anxiously awaiting any information he may have for us.

It was exceedingly thoughtful of you to write Mr. Carter and if you should happen to be in Fort Worth, he would be very happy to have you come by the office and maybe tell us some of the things you would not want to write, or if you felt disposed, you might call his office collect as any information would be gratefully received.
