Dear Mr. White:

Thank you very much for your letter of January 12 enclosing a copy of a letter from your son dated October 21. Mr. Carter is out of the State and I am therefore acknowledging it for him.

Until this morning October 10 was the latest letter Mr. Carter had from Amon Junior, however, Mrs. Carter, who lives in New York, telephoned me this morning that she had just received a card dated December 7. Others have received mail as late as December 14 from this camp.

Your son's letter indicates conditions that it is known exist and that they were out of Red Cross food parcels during October and possibly November; however, Mr. Carter has been advised that packages are being shipped into the camp again and that they are getting along as well as could be expected with 1200 officers there now. If we have any other news, I shall be glad to forward it along to you.
