

ALLIES LOSE TRACK OF POWS

Last-Known Sites of Nazi Camps Revealed

LONDON, March 27 (AP).—The chaos in Germany resulting from the Russian sweep towards Berlin and the British-American offensive on the west has caused the Allies to lose track of thousands of Allied soldiers taken prisoner by the enemy.

Sir James Grigg, British war secretary, replying to a question in Commons, gave the following list Tuesday of the last-known information concerning the German prisoner of war camps where the Allied soldiers were held.

(Stalag means enlisted men's camp, stalag luft airmen's camp and oflag officers' camp.)

Stalag 2-A, majority of prisoners dispatched by train to Stalag 357 at Fallingbostel in Hannover Province.

Stalag 2-B and 2-D were marching through Hannover Province on March 10.

Stalag Luft 4, have been distributed among Stalag Luft 1 at Barth on the Baltic; Stalag 10-B at Sandbostel south of Bremen; Stalag 11-B at Fallingbostel; Stalag 357 at Fallingbostel; and Stalag 13-D at Nuernberg.

Stalag 111-B, last known location at Stalag 111-A at Luckenwalde, south of Berlin.

Stalag 11-C, near Werneuchen, northeast of Berlin on March 10.

Stalag Luft 111, distributed among Marlag, Milag and Bremen; Stalag 7-A at Moosburg in Bavaria and Stalag 13-C at Hammelburg in northern Bavaria.

Stalag Luft 7, last known location at Stalag 111-A at Luckenwalde.

Stalag 8-A, sick entrained for Stalag 11-B and the remainder were marching east of Kena on March 9.

Stalag 8-B, on the march near Rakonitz in southern Bohemia on March 7. Some sick went by train to Stalag 13-B at Weiden.

Stalag 344 and dependent work detachments, distributed among Stalag 11-B at Fallingbostel; Stalag 11-C at Hammelburg; Stalag 7-A at Moosburg; at Stalag 9-B at Wegscheide Badorb in Thuringia.

Stalag 12-C, on the march west of Soemmerda in Thuringia.

Stalag 20-A and 20-B, on the march southwest of Danzig March 10.

Oflag 64, transferred to Oflag 13-B at Hammelburg.

Work detachments situated in the east of Stalag 4-A were evacuated westward March 13.
