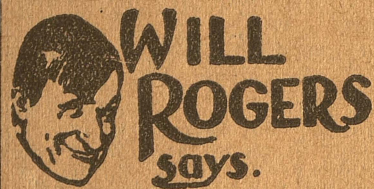


WILL ROGERS FLIES HERE TO SEE PONIES RUN

Will Rogers will attend the races at Arlington Downs this afternoon as the guest of W. T. Waggoner. He arrived by Bowen airplane from Tulsa shortly after noon and will leave by American Airways plane tonight for his home in California.



Will Rogers, flying into Fort Worth Saturday afternoon after visiting his native Claremore and its suburb, Tulsa, said:

This is a bad campaign, tempers been lost. Gentlemanly conduct is a lost art, but let's just stop and study a minute and give the rascals the benefit of the doubt. The Republicans have been in since 1920. Twelve years, and you would fight too if you was in their places. \$795,369 IS GIVEN TEXAS IN RELIEF PROGRAM

WASHINGTON, Nov. 5.—The Reconstruction Corporation Saturday made available to the Governor of Texas \$795,369 to meet emergency relief needs in 142 counties from Nov. 1 to Dec. 31.

The announcement said Governor Sterling has named a committee composed of managers of the three regional chambers of commerce of Texas to have charge of relief administration.

The corporation said the provisions of the Texas constitution "seem to prohibit the Legislature from making appropriations of public money to any individual, individuals municipal or corporations whatsoever."

The Texas Legislature does not convene in regular session until January and legislation could not be passed and become effective in time to meet the immediate emergency.

Texas previously had received \$366,597 for relief purposes.

Paris, Texas, Girl Found in Coma on Los Angeles Street
