

FIRST LADY AT LOS ANGELES AND 'ONE UP' ON WILL ROGERS

LOS ANGELES, June 7. — Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt has crossed the continent by air to the accompaniment of cheers of thousands who thronged the airports to catch a glimpse of the President's wife.

Tireless, smiling, she arrived on the Western seaboard from Washington Tuesday night. Wednesday she was a guest of Mrs. Franklin K. Lane, widow of the Interior Secretary in the Wilson Administration and a long time friend, but her privileged host was her own son, Elliott, whom she made the long trip to see.

Elliott met her at Douglas, Ariz., Monday.

Greeting her here at the airport personally were Mrs. Lane; her daughter-in-law, Mrs. Franklin Lane Jr.; Will Rogers, the humorist; Governor James Rolph Jr. and Mayor John C. Porter.

Mrs. Roosevelt was one up on Rogers in an interchange. Referring to the President, she remarked:

"He appreciates that you can take his jokes as he can take yours."

For once Rogers' tongue forsook him.

"Aw, gee, that's fine," he returned looking slightly abashed.

In deference to her wishes, Mrs. Roosevelt Wednesday was accorded privacy in her visit with her son, recently appointed the manager of a West Coast airlines. Although it was understood that her visit here might not exceed 24 hours, no time had been set for her return East.

Among those accompanying Mrs. Roosevelt on the flight from Phoenix, were Charles Hitchcock, former classmate of Elliott's, and Amon G. Carter, Fort Worth, Texas.
