Enclosed, herewith, you will find one of the pictures made at the time of Mrs. Roosevelt's arrival in Los Angeles which I think is one of the best pictures I have of you and I thought you might be interested in keeping a copy in your collection.

I just arrived home by plane this morning from Memphis where I stopped off to participate in the Farley rally in connection with the Repeal of the Eighteenth Amendment. We had a great time.

I am leaving Tuesday night with the children for Chicago to take in the Century of Progress. They are going up on the train and I am flying. This will give me 7,000 miles in the past seven weeks. Really, it is the only way to travel. I was in Washington two weeks and in New York two days. Everybody is feeling much better. Cotton and wheat are certainly going up and it looks like we will all have a chance to pull out solvent after all.
