SAN ANTONIO WELCOMES GARNER, FARLEY

SAN ANTONIO, Oct. 20.—Greeted by high ranking officers of the United States Army, the plane bearing Vice President Garner, Postmaster General Farley and other Washington officials arrived at Randolph Field here at 10:25 o'clock Friday morning.

In the welcoming party were Brig. Gen. Charles H. Danforth and Lieut. Col. F. H. Martin.

Will Rogers, the humorist, accompanied the official party. In another plane were L. B. Manning, chairman of the board of American Airways, and C. R. Smith, vice president of the Southern division of the same organization, with places in the official party.

After landing at Randolph Field the planes were escorted to Dodd Field, five miles from San Antonio, where the notables were greeted by Maj. Gen. Johnson Haggood, commanding general of the Eighth Corps Area.

From Dodd Field the entire party proceeded by car to downtown San Antonio, with a reception by city officials at the Alamo to precede the official luncheon.

More than 650 reservations had been made for the luncheon, at which Congressman Dick Kleberg will be the principal speaker.

When the party proceeds Friday afternoon to Garner's home in Uvalde, the large planes will be abandoned in favor of smaller planes from Kelly Field, the landing at Uvalde being not suitable for the larger craft in which the officials have traveled this far.

GARNER AND FARLEY STOP HERE BRIEFLY.

Leaving this section of Texas, where they were entertained at numerous events, Vice President Garner and Postmaster General Farley en route to San Antonio, stopped briefly Friday morning at the Municipal Airport. Other members of their party who were honored in Fort Worth Wednesday and Thursday and at Dallas Thursday night, were in the Garner-Farley airplane.

At Fort Worth Will Rogers and Amon G. Carter joined the party for the South Texas trip. After a banquet at San Antonio the party will visit Uvalde, home of Garner, and then will be taken for a day's stop at the ranch of R. W. Morrison in Southwest Texas. While in San Antonio the guests will visit the Alamo and the military posts.

Two other planes, carrying some members of the Farley-Garner party, left Dallas early Friday and went direct to San Antonio.

EXES ARRIVING FOR TCU RALLY

Homecoming "exes" of Texas Christian University were arriving Friday morning to take part in the bonfire pep rally tonight at 7:30 o'clock on the university campus. It is the first major event of the homecoming program which will be climaxed in the annual T. C. U.-Texas A. & M. football game Saturday at 3 p. m.

The T. C. U. Ex-Lettermen's Association will hold its annual banquet tonight at 6:30 o'clock in the university cafeteria. Bernard (Blackie) Williams, president, will preside.

The pep rally will begin with talks by prominent "exes," a concert by the Horned Frog Band and yell practice in the basket ball gymnasium. Then the bonfire will be lighted. Boys of the freshman class will stage a snake dance around the fire. The same group will put on its yearly shirt-tail parade in the downtown section.

Activities will be concluded tonight with a midnight show sponsored by the junior class at the Liberty Theater. It also will be guest night for town girls in Jarvis Hall.

The majority of the homecomers will arrive Saturday morning and will be served coffee and sandwiches in Jarvis Hall upon their arrival. At 10 o'clock they will assemble according to classes in the main building for a general get-together, and at 10:30 o'clock they will meet in the auditorium for a mass "spontaneous combustion" meeting. Prof. Edwin A. Elliott will be the principal speaker.
