The humorist went to Dallas soon after yesterday's game ended, to inaugurate his Fall series of broadcasts over the Columbia network. He worked last night in the studios of Station KRLD. In the program he was interviewed by Harold Hough, the Hired Hand of Station WBAP.

He liked crossing Siberia better than any part of his recent trip to Europe—eight days on one train was kinda monotonous, but there's

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a certain romance about snowy Siberia in his eyes. May be some things he dislikes about Europe, but he ain't a-sayin'—"It's their country, let 'em run it."

Rogers' next picture will be "The County Chairman," a famous old play with a smatterin' of politics.

His daughter, Mary, is in New York studying for the stage and Will Jr. is back in Leland Stanford University.

"Does it give you any particular pleasure, Mr. Rogers, that the Legion of Decency always holds upyour pictures as shining examples of what this country needs most of?"
