in Town.

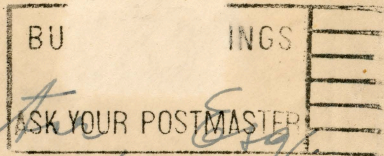
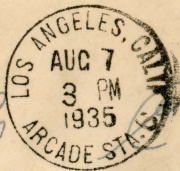
Mr. Rogers breezed
