Carter to Meet Funeral Plane at Seattle, Wash.

Nashville (UP)—Amon G. Carter, publisher of the Fort Worth-Star Telegram, and close friend of Will Rogers stopped at Sky Harbor Airport near here yesterday afternoon, en route from New York to Seattle by air.

Carter will accompany the "flying hearse" from Seattle to Los Angeles. In a telephone conversation with James G. Stahlman, publisher of the Nashville Banner, Carter said the plane bearing the bodies of Rogers and Wiley Post, round the world flier, who were killed Thursday night when their plane crashed in Alaska will probably leave Seattle Monday morning.

Carter, who was in New York when he learned of the double tragedy, hurried to Showhegan, Maine, to Mrs. Rogers and her daughter Mary, and assisted in making plans for the return of the bodies by Pan American Airways.
