## Texas Publisher Plans to Escort 'Flying Hearse'

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Aug. 17.—Amon G. Carter, publisher of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram, and close Irlend of Will Rogers, stopped at Sky Harbor airport near here today enroute from New York to Seattle by air.

Carter will accompany the "flying hearse" from Seattle to Los Angeles.

James G. Stahlman, publisher of the Nashville banner, Carter said the plane bearing the bodies of Rogers and Wiley Post, round the world flier, who were killed Thursday night when their plane crashed in Alaska, will probably leave Seattle Monday morning.

Carter, who was in New York when he learned of the double tragedy, hurried to Skowhegan, Maine, to Mrs. Rogers and her daughter Mary, and assisted in making plans for the return of the bodies by Pan American Airways.
