Rogers' Gifts To Charities Are Revealed

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 22.—(AP)—
Amon G. Carter, prominent Fort
Worth, Tex., publisher and an in-
timate friend of Will Rogers for 20
years, disclosed today that the
humorist-actor's gifts to two favor-
ite organizations amounted to thou-
sands of dollars.

Carter said he was with Rogers
when he made the first of a series
of radio broadcasts for an oil com-
pany. The comedian, he said, re-
ceived \$50,000 for seven appear-
ances on the air—and of the sum
gave \$25,000 to the American Red
Cross, and \$25,000 to the Salvation
Army.

"In 1930 alone," the publisher re-
called, "he raised over \$275,000 for
the Red Cross, all of which went
for the benefit of humanity, Will
paying the expense of the tour,
over \$12,000, personally.
