

MORE GIFTS TO ROGERS FUND ANNOUNCED

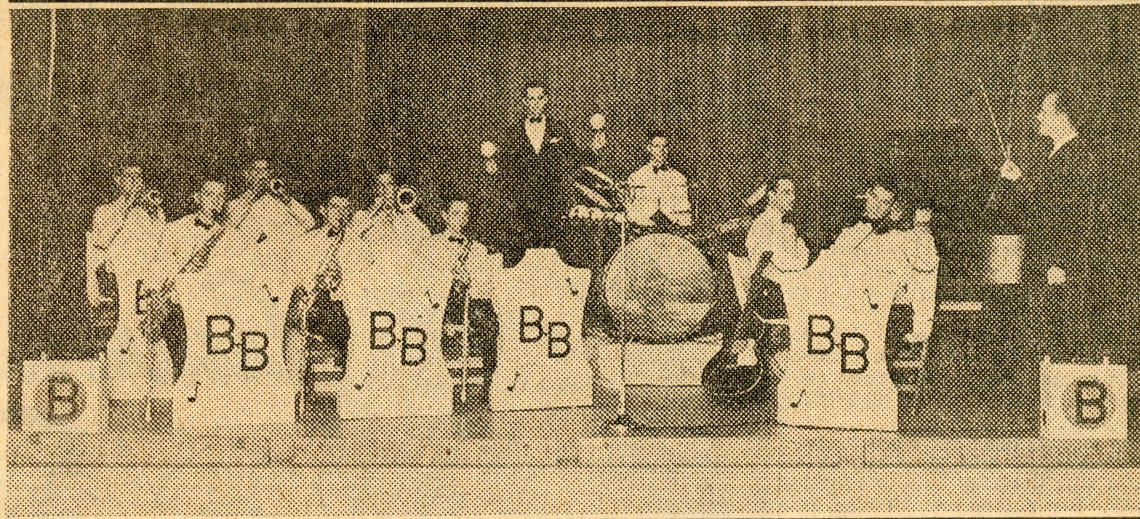
Christmas gifts to the Will Rogers Memorial Fund were asked by the headquarters for the movement here Wednesday in announcing more subscriptions.

Since the money is to be used to aid unfortunate and handicapped children as well as to perpetuate the memory of the humorist-philosopher who raised and gave more for charity than he left for his own family, the memorial fund affords an ideal means for Christmas giving, it was announced.

Personal contributions by those in the latest seven employe groups to subscribe 100 per cent to the fund average nearly \$1.20 each. Mackey Street Job to Start Thursday

County Judge Moore will be master of ceremonies and George L. Dickey, district WPA director, will make the principal address at a highway groundbreaking celebration at 9 a. m. Thursday at Avenue F and Mackey Street.

The groundbreaking will mark the beginning of the Mackey Street-Handley link of the Rosedale project and give Polytechnic both a new artery to the South Side and the business district as well as a new connection with the Fort Worth-Dallas Pike.

The East Fort Worth Lions Club, as sponsors of the celebration, has asked County Commissioner Thannison to turn the first shovelful of dirt. Estimated cost of the link is \$150,000.

RESETTLEMENT WORK APPROVED BY M'CARL

WASHINGTON, Dec. 11 (AP).—Comptroller General McCarl has approved resettlement projects to cost approximately \$50,000,000. They will be located in all 48 States.

Rexford G. Tugwell, administrator who recently was criticized by Republicans because of alleged delays in getting his projects under way, said that to the 50 projects approved 30 soon will be added.

Each project, Tugwell said, will cost about \$1,000,000, but no estimate was made of the number of families to be affected. The plan is to move families from poor to better land.
