Let me suggest to you that the Will Rogers Memorial Association make a definite statement to the effect that the memorial will take some useful form, such as a hospital for crippled children, a home for the aged, a hospital for the treatment of ills in general, or something of that character. I have met a great deal of opposition in the solicitation of funds here in Buffalo from people who say they are not in sympathy with erecting a shaft for Will Rogers which will serve no useful purpose. I, therefore, believe that if this is the case in Buffalo, the same condition must exist in certain quarters in other localities.
