We were mighty glad to hear that the exhibit arrived safely and intact. It was more or less of a mental strain until it had been placed safely back in place.

Mr. Carter left this morning on the Star-Telegram Football special train carrying about 200 fans, including the team and T.C.U's forty piece band, to San Francisco, where they will play Santa Clara on December 12th. Mr. Carter will arrive in Los Angeles the morning of the 13th and will be at the Biltmore for that day, returning home on the morning of December 16th.
