Mrs. Broquette, instructor in Spanish, will speak on the "Relations Between the United States and Spanish America" tomorrow morning at a meeting of the Central Texas Chapter of the American Association of Teachers of Spanish. The speech will be in Spanish. The morning program will begin at 9:45 o'clock and the afternoon program will close at 3 o'clock. T. C. U. faculty members are cordially invited to both sessions. The afternoon session will be a round table discussion of the teaching of Spanish.

Dr. George H. Shull of Princeton University, well-known botanist, has expressed interest in the further investigation of the effects of very intense sound, being carried on by Prof. Chambers and Prof. Gaines by contributing pedigreed oenothera (evening primrose) seed with which any environmental effects can be measured quantitatively. Profs. Gaines and Chambers were recently awarded some apparatus by the American Association for the Advancement of Science for the further study of their project.

There will be a general rehearsal for "The Sunset Trail" Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the Magnolia Christian Church. Director Sam Losh is anxious to have all singers present.
