BUILDING COMMITTEE OF OKLAHOMA WILL ROGERS MEMORIAL COMMISSION IN MEETING AT OKLAHOMA CITY TODAY HAS JUST BEEN ADVISED THROUGH HON. PATRICK J. HURLEY THAT ALLOCATION OF FUNDS WERE MADE LAST SATURDAY DISTRIBUTING MONEYS RAISED IN NATION-WIDE WILL ROGERS FUND RAISING PROGRAM STOP THE OKLAHOMA COMMISSION VERY SERIOUSLY PROTESTS THE ALLOCATION AS ARRIVED AT AND DESIRES THAT MATTER BE HELD OPEN UNTIL CAN BE PROPERLY PRESENTED STOP OKLAHOMA COMMISSION HAS BEEN ADVISED BY LETTER FROM SEVERAL MEMBERS OF NATIONAL ORGANIZATION THAT PORTION OF FUNDS WOULD BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR USE OF OKLAHOMA COMMISSION IN CONSTRUCTING WILL ROGERS MEMORIAL AT CLARENCE OKLAHOMA STOP ON JUNE TWELFTH 1937 JESSE H.
